- WHEREAS: Mary McCafferty entered the employment of the city in 1970 assigned to the Recreation Department under the direction of Paul G. Cowles and later John E. Deluise, both of whom served as Superintendent of the Recreation Department and who sought Mary out for advice and guidance during their tenure; and
- WHEREAS: The consolidation of several human service departments into the Department of Human Service Programs provided Mary the opportunity to serve as the department's receptionist beginning in 1981, a position which placed her in the forefront of the departments information services, meeting and greeting people from all walks of life on a daily basis while serving as the mainstay of the office clerical pool; and
- WHEREAS: Mary's friends, colleague and associates will join to honor her and recognize her long friendship and dedication to the people of Cambridge at a party to be held on Friday, July 6, 1990 at the East Cambridge VFW Post; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record extending its deepest appreciation to Mary McCafferty for her dedicated service to the citizens of Cambridge and further to extend to her every good wish for continued good health and happiness during her retirement; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mary McCafferty on behalf of the entire City Council.
