- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that James G. Mulcahy, long time Assistant Administrator of the Michael J. Neville Manor, will retire from said position to enjoy a life of leisure with his wife Mary; and
- WHEREAS: Jim first began his public service career on March 29, 1971, when he was appointed Project Coordinator of a special task force of City Manager John H. Corcoran, established to deal with the growing problem of unemployment of local residents; and
- WHEREAS: Jim later was appointed Director of the City's Free Employment Office, where he was responsible for the day to day administration of nearly one million dollars of federal manpower funds, the "72-73" Youth Summer Employment Program and acted as a Staff Assistant to the Budget-Personnel Director and, in that capacity, he played a key role in establishing a central referral and placement system for prospective city employees; and
- WHEREAS: Jim has served as both Assistant Administrator, and Administrator of the Michael J. Neville Manor at various times in his career from 1973 to the present, serving the aged and infirmed with a level of dedication, sincerity and compassion which has proved to be a role model for other staff and administrators throughout the City of Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: Prior to Jim's employment with the city, he held a variety of administrative and supervisory positions at S. S. Pierce Company during his twenty-seven year career, one which saw his rise through the organization to become Administrative Services Manager for the entire company; and
- WHEREAS: Jim, a World War II veteran, who served his country as a Captain in the United States Army, is a long time member of the V.F.W. Post 7353 in North Cambridge, as well as a Delph Nu Alpha of the Knights of Columbus; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its sincere best wishes and congratulations to James G. Mulcahy as he retires from municipal service and to further wish both he and his wife much happiness and good health in the future; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. Mulcahy on behalf of the entire City Council.
