

## **MBTA probes Red Line death**

Late last week MBTA police were investigating the death of a man who was hit by a northbound Red Line subway train last Wednesday afternoon at the Porter Square station in North Cambridge.

A spokesman for the MBTA said the man's name could not be released until his relatives were notified.

The MBTA said police are not ruling out anything in their investigation, but did not have any specific information about the incident as the probe started.



## Crime

According to police, a mother called to report that her daughters had been confronted by a female juvenile while rollerblading in

Donnelly Field. The suspect and her friends allegedly knocked the girls down, pulled their hair, spit on them and shouted racial slurs.

The suspect also threatened to kill the two victims.

The girls' mother also stated that a group of juveniles later approached her house and attempted to gain entry.
