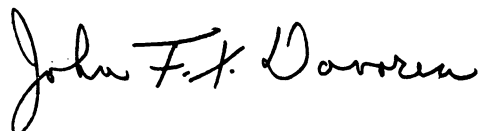

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

1. To develop community residences in the Cambridge - Somerville area for mentally retarded young adults and adults.
2. To be responsive to the welfare and needs of each individual in the residences.
3. To govern and direct these community residences.
4. To cooperate with public and private agencies engaged in programs for the mentally retarded
5. To solicit and receive funds for the accomplishment of these purposes.

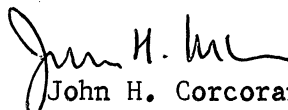
