RESOLVED:

That the City Council of Cambridge, Massachusetts, U.S.A., hereby resolves to request the appropriate officials of Sudan to make public the reasons for the arrest of Clement Mboro, Samuel Aru Bol, Joseph Oduho, Martin Majier Gai and Maikol Wal, and to advise whether the rights of these persons are being observed under the United National Universal Declaration of Human Rights. As elected governmental officials in a democratic society, the Cambridge City Councillors wish to say to Sudan officials that governmental service and political activity should never result in the violation of a person's liberty, and further that disregard of the personal rights of members of a political opposition creates a destabilizing force in the world.
