- WHEREAS: The City Council of Cambridge regularly deliberates and establishes policy concerning ways its municipal agencies can target resources to address the needs of the City's Senior Citizens; and
- WHEREAS: In the process of harnessing government to respond to these needs, there is the potential of losing sight of the parallel efforts of others in our community who give of themselves freely and enthusiastically to assist their fellow man; and
- WHEREAS: The tradition of privately generated social service has its roots in this city as attested to in the establishment of one of our nation's first settlement houses, the Cambridge Neighborhood House, founded by Pauline Agassiz Shaw in the 19th century; and
- WHEREAS: This tradition of private involvement in bringing comfort, happiness and hope to one's neighbors was again recently and vividly restated by a member of the Cambridge business community, Mr. Lawrence Kimmelman, President of Kimco Corporation, and owner of the McDonald's Restaurant in Central Square; and
- WHEREAS: That statement of concern took the form of sharing presents, music, a hearty meal and the holiday spirit with over 300 "Older Kids" at McDonald's Annual Cambridge Senior Citizens' Christmas Breakfast held on Saturday, December 18, 1976; and
- WHEREAS: It is fitting that the city appropriately recognize such outpourings of sentiment and concern, especially during this season of brotherhood and good will to man;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

The City Council of Cambridge go on record commending the Central Square McDonald's Restaurant and its owner, Mr. Lawrence Kimmelman, for the community spirit evidenced by his hosting the Annual Cambridge Senior Citizens' Christmas Breakfast; and

FURTHERMORE BE IT RESOLVED that:

Extends Mr. Kimmelman and his family best wishes for a happy holiday season, and

Requests that an appropriately embossed copy of this resolve be forwarded him; and

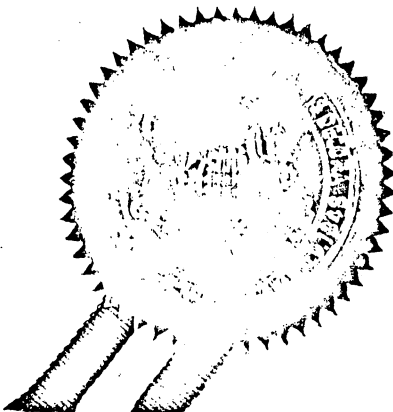
Hereby extends these same good tidings to all senior citizens who attended this Christmas Breakfast; and
