WHEREAS: During the past council term a request was made to draft an ordinance dealing with "Repeat Violators" of the Sanitary Code and thus far we have not received a response to the order; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to direct the Law Department with the cooperation of the Inspectional Services Department to draft a proposed ordinance that would deal with this situation and report back to the City Council within 30 days.

I hope you are enjoying a happy and restful holiday season.

I would like to bring an issue to your attention. As many of you know CASCAP, Inc., has begun renovating the house at the corner of Magazine and Chalk Street in order for to convert the house to a group home for ten mentally ill residents.

Many of you attended a meeting many months ago when the plans were in the preliminary phases. Residents of the neighborhood have asked me questions about the facility, and I feel that it is important to have a chance for discussion to address any issues that might remain. In addition the agency is interested in setting up a neighborhood advisory committee, and has promised tours of other group homes to neighborhood residents.

For this reason I am calling a meeting of interested neighborhood residents on Tuesday, December 10, 1991 at 7:00 p.m. in the Gym at the Graham and Parks School. Our agenda will be:

1. Introduction
2. Presentation from CASCAP
3. Questions and Discussion from Neighborhood Residents
4. Tour for those interested of the Magazine Street location.

In issues like these, no viewpoints are right or wrong, but they only help us to better understand our neighborhood. With a twenty month-old daughter, and living on Chalk Street, I understand the concerns raised by neighborhood residents about safety, but I think if we work together, we can address the concerns we have in constructive way, and work sensibly with members of CASCAP, Inc.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. I look forward to seeing you on December 10, 1991.
