- WHEREAS: Donna Brescia is about to complete two three-year terms of service to the women of Cambridge as a member, officer and chairperson of the Women's Commission, the maximum period of service allowed under the ordinance; and
- WHEREAS: Donna Brescia has provided particular leadership in the area of housing for women and their families in her capacities as a professional in the field and as a committed activist; and
- WHEREAS: Donna Brescia has also contributed enthusiasm and good humor to every project she has undertaken; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council commends Donna Brescia for her six continuous years of service to the women of Cambridge as a member and officer of the Cambridge Commission on the Status of Women; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That a duly engrossed copy of this resolution be presented to Donna Brescia at the June 8, 1989 reunion of former members and staff of the Cambridge Commission on the Status of Women.
