# Lowell strikes in nick of time

For 31 minutes Friday night, Lawrence was the jackrabbit, resting then running, but never quite running away. But in the last minute of play in a wild Merrimack Valley Conference schoolboy basketball shootout, Lowell proved what everybody knows: The tortoise can play basketball, too.

It was as hostile an environment as any high school team will ever play in, and after Lowell's 75-72 win over host Lawrence, the Red Raiders appear primed for a run at the Division 1 state title.

"Our players loved it," Lowell coach Bob Melillo said of the packed, screaming crowd in Lawrence. "They really get into it."

Lowell was behind right from the start, facing early 14-4 and 22-6 deficits. But Lowell never quit. While Lawrence was running up and down the court, Lowell was more methodical, choosing to play at its own pace rather than let Lawrence dictate a faster speed.

"They stayed calm, cool and didn't get flustered," Melillo said. "We've been down like that before."

Using full-court pressure, Lowell went on a 10-0 run that closed the Red Raiders to within 22-16. Lawrence was up 41-33 at the half but the stage was set for a wild final 16 minutes.

Much like the first half, Lowell fell behind again, this time 65-55 with seven minutes left. But Lowell again came back, and a series of charging calls and poor shot selection by the hosts allowed the Red Raiders to seize control. Kevin Rourke and Jim Zorbas then put the contest away in the last minute, capping

a 12-3 Lowell run over the final five minutes.

Derek Randall scored 37 points and had 16 rebounds as St. Columbkille defeated Maimonides, 70-69, on Friday.

Shanita Horton's 34 points were not enough Friday night, as the Charlestown Townies fell to Madison Park, 65-46.

**CENTRAL HOOPS:** The ball is always in her hands. If it's not in her hands the team struggles. Her name is Missy Kobus and the Clinton High girls team is 15-0 with her handling the show.

Kobus, a four-year starter, can dish the pass and hit the three. She scored her 1,000th point midseason last year as a junior and is currently averaging 26 points a game along with eight assists. She is the all-time leading scorer at Clinton High School with 1,552 points and six games still to be played.

"She's the best by far. Teams

constantly throw multiple defenses at us to stop her, but it never works," said coach Bernie Gaughan. "She's very quiet except when she's on the court."

According to Gaughan, Kobus is a coach on the court. Kobus has to score about half the team's points for Clinton to win. Friday against Lunenburg, which is led by another talented guard, Marcia Price (St. John's signee), Kobus scored 27 points leading the Gaels to a 54-44 victory.

Senior center Bill Lahey connected on four goals to lead Weymouth over Quincy, 5-2. Lahey scored seven goals last week, including a hat trick earlier in the week.

Junior center Sean O'Connell of Triton collected one goal and two assists this week to put him over the 100-point career mark. O'Connell has 101 points (40 goals and 61 assists).

Wakefield senior Wayne Strauss connected on five goals for the week, including a hat trick in a 5-1 win over Belmont on Saturday.

## NCC gives McGrail No. 100

Senior guard Migel Woodward scored 22 points and freshman point guard Anthony Taylor hit for 15 to go along with 12 assists as North Cambridge Catholic defeated St. Columbkille, 79-62, in a schoolboy basketball contest yesterday.

The victory was the 100th at the school for North Cambridge coach Frank McGrail. McGrail coached NCC for two years in the early '60s and returned to coach the school seven years ago. "I've

been coaching for five decades," said McGrail. "I started in 1958 at St. Thomas and now I'm in the '90s."

North Cambridge came out quick and never looked back. "We had control of the game from the start. We were a little too strong for them," said McGrail.

Six-foot-six center Derek Randall scored 27 to lead St. Columbkille.

action, St. Clement's (9-5) topped Marian (6-9), 66-64, behind 19 points from senior guard John Gamble and 15 from senior center Gene Morris, who also added 14 rebounds.

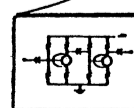
