SUBJECT: Neighborhood Census data
DATE: September 27, 1983

Census data are now available for each of Cambridge's neighborhoods. The Census Bureau provided a 26-page summary report with tables covering all 13 neighborhoods and separate 9-page narrative reports for each neighborhood. I am enclosing four (4) pages with some of the most-requested tables. Please read the note about the accuracy of Neighborhood 12 (Cambridge Highlands) information.

This is the first time that detailed census data have been provided by neighborhood. Previous neighborhood reports were based on data from census tracts or block groups, but their boundaries did not usually coincide with those of the neighborhoods.

Neighborhood profiles will be prepared here this fall and winter to analyze demographic changes since 1970. In the meantime, you should contact me if you are interested in the 1980 reports. Copies will be provided free to City employees and neighborhood planning teams and associations. For all others, there is a photocopying charge of five cents (5¢) per page.

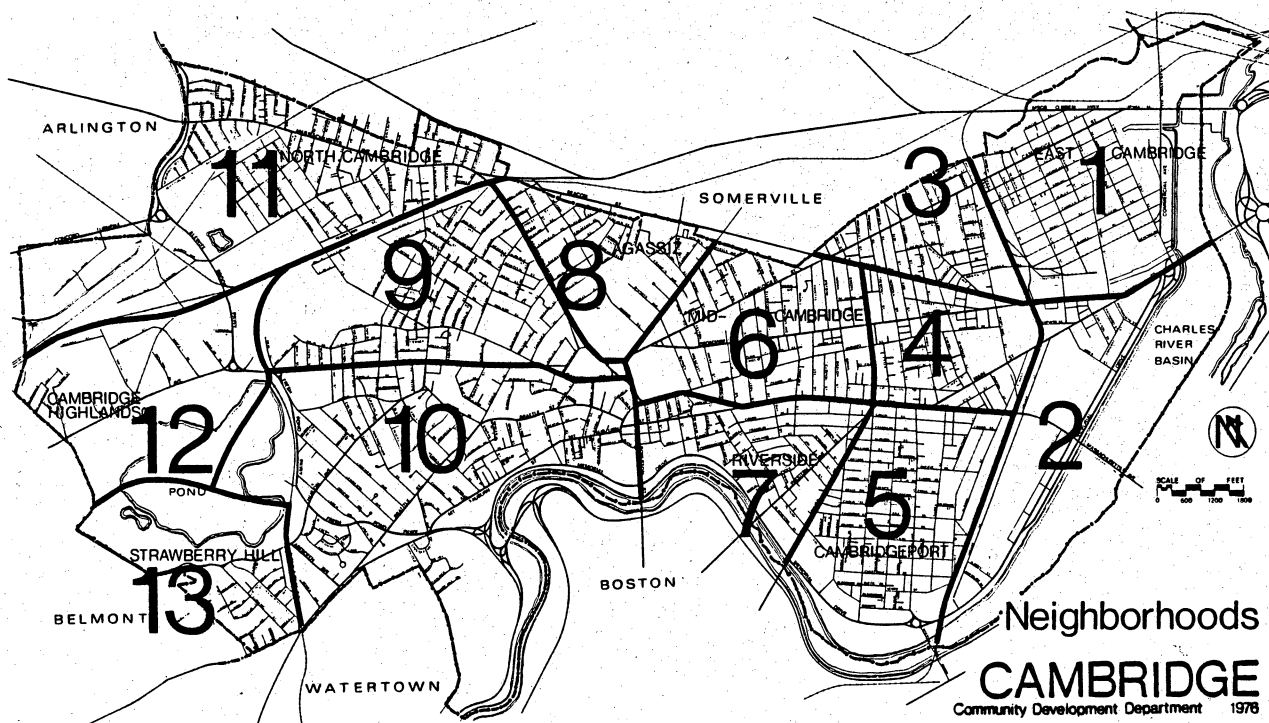

* The figures for Neighborhood 12 (Cambridge Highlands) and, to a much lesser extent, Neighborhood 9 should be used with caution. It was necessary to "move" 437 persons from Neighborhood 9 into 12 to raise its population above 1,000. Otherwise, the Census Bureau would suppress or change some data throughout the City to protect the confidentiality of Neighborhood 12 respondents.

The part of Neighborhood 9 that was "moved" is the large block bounded by Sherman (including Bellis Circle), Walden, Garden and Field Streets, Bay State Road and the Boston and Maine Railroad tracks. That block encompasses about 220 housing units with 437 residents, including 85 subsidized and 69 market-rate units at the Briston Arms apartments.

The switch resulted in a 63% population gain for Neighborhood 12, but only a 4% loss for Neighborhood 9 (with an original population of 11,082).

It was necessary to "move" 437 persons from Neighborhood 9 into 12 to raise its population above 1,000. Otherwise, the Census Bureau would suppress or change some data throughout the City to protect the confidentiality of Neighborhood 12 respondents.

The part of Neighborhood 9 that was "moved" is the large block bounded by Sherman (including Bellis Circle), Walden, Garden and Field Streets, Bay State Road and the Boston and Maine Railroad tracks. That block encompasses about 220 housing units with 437 residents, including 85 subsidized and 69 market-rate units at the Briston Arms apartments.

The switch resulted in a 63% population gain for Neighborhood 12, but only a 4% loss for Neighborhood 9 (with an original population of 11,082).
