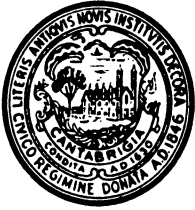

REFERENCE:

In response to City Council Order #43 of 5/21/90 regarding the possibility of gang related violence and drug trafficking, the Cambridge Police Department maintains an on-going, cooperative relationship with the M.B.T.A. Police Department. The M.B.T.A. Police have established a sub-station at the Alewife Station. The M.B.T.A. Police maintain a regular patrol route at Alewife Station from 9:00a to 9:00p daily and take all reports of crime occurring at the Station.

The Cambridge Police Department responds to Alewife Station as the need arises. Through intelligence sharing meetings with both the M.B.T.A. Police and the Boston Police, information is gathered on both gangs and drug activity. If more specific information is available, the Police Department will investigate.
