WHEREAS: During his 18 years as Chaplain at the Harvard-Radcliffe Catholic Student Center and as Pastor at St. Paul Church, recently ordained Auxiliary Bishop John P. Boles, Bishop of the Central Region of the Archdiocese of Boston, not only served those communities well but exhibited an intense commitment to and involvement in addressing the problem of homelessness in the wider Cambridge community; and

WHEREAS: That the obligation to feed the hungry and house the homeless must be practiced as well as preached is evident in the way he worked with the City, Harvard University and the neighborhood to assure that as part of the construction process of the new St. Paul Parish Center, the former St. Paul Rectory would be renovated into 19 single room occupancy housing units with 2 additional family units. As Cardinal Law's Regional Vicar, he shepherded the process whereby the former St. Patrick Church Complex on York Street would be used initially for an interim period as a shelter for women and, ultimately, renovated into 32 housing units for residents of low and moderate income. This tangible evidence of his walking his talk where it was needed in Cambridge should be an incentive for others, including the City of Cambridge itself, to do likewise; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That, in recognition and appreciation of his enduring efforts to alleviate a degree of homelessness in Cambridge by providing for creation of a substantial number of new housing units, this City Council declares that the intersection of Mount Auburn and DeWolfe Streets be designated as Bishop John P. Boles Square; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to take the necessary steps to have appropriate signage of said designation prepared and arrange for a public dedication/unveiling of same at Mount Auburn and DeWolfe Streets as soon as possible at a date and time which is convenient to Bishop Boles. Further, that the City Manager confer with Rev. J. Bryan Hehir, Pastor at St. Paul Church, regarding a site to serve refreshments to the invited guests.
