

Cambridge, Aug 11. 1865.

To the Honorable, the Mayor, and Aldermen,
of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned respectfully pray that represent that
Temple Street has been dedicated to the public
use and has been a street thirty feet in width
for more than forty years, as your petitioners are
advised and believe; that Mr. Jacob W. Seaver
is erecting a granite building at the corner of Main
and Temple Streets, and is laying the foundation
of his wall so as to encroach upon Temple Street
and ~~will~~ to leave it only about twenty-seven feet and
a half in width at the end next Main Street and
for the distance of at least fifty feet from Main
Street.

Your Petitioners earnestly pray that your Honor-
able Board will meet upon the ground and take
action in relation to said encroachment before any
further expense is incurred.
