The undersigned respectfully ~~pray~~ remonstrate against any widening of Inman Street which will render it necessary to remove any of the fine trees which now make the street so attractive.

They respectfully represent that, as the angle in the street is at the South West end of Austin Street, the North West end of Inman Street might with advantage be curved, opposite Austin Street, but they further submit that, as the fences now stand and have stood for many years at that point, there is a proper curve more than sufficient for all purposes.

They further pray that, before any action is taken, your Honorable Board will examine the premises.

To the Honorable, the City Council,

of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned ~~respectfully pray~~ residents and owners of land upon Inman St. in said Cambridge respectfully pray that said St. may be widened upon the westerly side, opposite to, and near Austin St. Said street being upwards of forty feet in width at Main St. and nearly a uniform width of thirty ~~seventy~~ feet north from Austin St.

It is but thirty three feet in width opposite the south side of said Austin St. We therefore, ask that a curved line may be substituted in place of the angle now existing in said street by taking land at present wholly unoccupied, and that said improvement may be made subject to the prevailing betterment law, or in such manner as your Honorable Board may deem proper.
