Hi! How are you? I'm writing to let you know that I will be the City Editor of The Crimson for the next year, so if you have any questions or comments about our coverage, or story ideas, please call me at 576-6565 or email them to me at ebcolby@fas.harvard.edu.

I have many goals for the upcoming year. Among them, I want to expand our coverage of city issues and increase our presence in the city through expanded distribution of The Crimson at neighborhood stores. Do you have any suggestions for neighborhood stores which you think would be good places to sell The Crimson? I know in the past The Crimson has been sold at more locations than just Out of Town News; and, as the city's only daily newspaper, I see no reason why we shouldn't return to increased distribution. (Now I just have to convince the Business Department.) As it stands now, Cantabrigians can only really read The Crimson online. And, frankly, I believe we cover issues more thoroughly than The Chronicle does, but The Chronicle is able to cover a wider range of issues. By expanding distribution, and by writing more stories about Cambridge's neighborhoods, I hope to make The Crimson a well-written alternative to The Chronicle which Cantabrigians will actually read.

I am the beat editor for the City Council, the School Committee/Public Schools, Business, National and State Politics, Harvard-city education programs, and PBHA. There are also two other part-time City editors this year, Nate Schwartz (nschwartz@fas.harvard.edu), who is in charge of Town-Gown Relations and Housing & Development (and who is also a homegrown Cantabrigian), and Robbie Silverman (rsilverm@fas.harvard.edu), who covers Police/Crime and Local Politicians.
