- WHEREAS: Our nation's schools face a critical shortfall in the availability of qualified math and science teachers who can successfully prepare young people for challenging careers in science and for the ever-changing skills needed in a technology-oriented society; and
- WHEREAS: A workforce literate in science and mathematics is essential to our nation's capacity to thrive in an increasingly competitive international marketplace; and
- WHEREAS: Polaroid Corporation, founded and headquartered in Cambridge, and dedicated to training and education for its own work force, has created Project Bridge, a unique, award-winning collaboration among industry, higher education and the public schools; and
- WHEREAS: Project Bridge trains seasoned industry professionals for second careers in teaching, primarily through programs at Lesley College and the Harvard University Graduate School of Education; and
- WHEREAS: Project Bridge supports and broadens the skills of public school math and science teachers by providing a sabbatical year of industry experience at Polaroid; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Mayor and the Cambridge City Council expresses its thanks to the Polaroid Corporation for this innovative program and the participation of Cambridge in it; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the Mayor of Cambridge and the Cambridge City Council declare Wednesday, June 20, 1990 as Project Bridge Day; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Polaroid Corporation.
