Dear Mr. Secretary:

Under date of August 14, 1985 I informed you of the result of the decision handed down August 1, 1985 by the Supreme Judicial Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts that our work involving named chemical agent testing, i.e., CSM material, was subject to an order issued by the Health Commissioner of the City of Cambridge and would have to cease. I also requested removal of the material from our premises in accordance with requirements of the City order and in accord with the regulations of your Department.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that, as of this date, all of the named agent material has been removed from our premises by the United States Army, and by copy hereof I am informing the City of Cambridge and the Clerk of the Supreme Judicial Court that compliance with the order and the decision of the Court is now complete.

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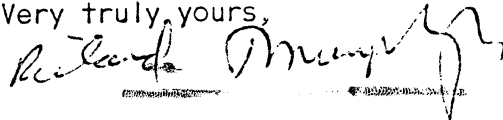
