- WHEREAS: A great deal of confusion has been expressed about the city's policy of booting cars; and
- WHEREAS: Such a lack of information causes confusion and anger among drivers and often volatile situations aimed at parking control officers, parking office staff people, and others attempting to do their job; and
- WHEREAS: A clearer understanding of the booting regulations would go a long way towards easing this tension; now therefore be it
- ORDERED: That the Traffic and Parking Office publish a clear set of booting regulations and that an abbreviated notice of these regulations be included on tickets and notice forms mailed to violators; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the Traffic and Parking Office be instructed to develop a special notice on BOOT ELIGIBILITY to be mailed ten days prior to placing any vehicle on the boot list; and be it further
- ORDERED: That this order be referred to the City Manager and Director of Traffic and Parking with the request that a response be developed pursuant to this order and that said response be submitted to the City Council for review.
