Subject Elder's Mobile Market

The Elder's Mobile Market was a program associated with the Cambridge Food Co-op which operated for approximately 3 years, with funding from the Community Development Block Grant Program, Somerville/Cambridge Elder Services, and private foundation monies.

In the last several years, the program began to have problems, including:

- withdrawal of Title III-B funds from the program (administered by Somerville/Cambridge Elder Services).
- increased difficulty in finding private foundation money for the program due to increased competition, and the longevity of the program (some foundations will only give once or twice).
- the program was a one-vehicle operation with an aging bus and no capital to replace it.
- changing Cambridge Food Co-op situation meant that fewer volunteer hours were being pledged to their program, resulting in higher food mark-ups in order to cover the cost of paid staff members in the Cambridge Food Co-op.

In recognition of these problems, and in an effort to maintain services for those most in need, the CDBG Human Service category of Food and Nutrition Services was put out for an open and competitive bid.

The Elder's Mobile Market did not bid on this contract. The director of the program was providing technical assistance to another new program, and at the point of the RFP issuance in February, joined the board of directors of Food For Free and assisted them in applying for what had previously been Mobile Market money. This was done with the support of the City, in a mutual desire to see continuation for those most in need, and expansion in some other areas.

After receipt of the proposal, and an interview between the Food For Free board and the Cambridge Human Service Commission, Food For Free was recommended for funding.

As part of the close-out of the Mobile Market, an elderly service directory will be distributed to former users, including lists of elderly transportation services (which might be available to take elders shopping), neighborhood nutrition sites, and grocery stores which deliver.

The Food For Free program will make 20 regularly scheduled trips per week, some of which will be the same sites currently served by the Elder's Mobile Market. The actual delivery schedule has not yet been negotiated, but will include elderly housing, public housing family developments, emergency and halfway houses, children's programs, and homeless feeding programs.

Beginning on July 1st, or as soon as possible thereafter, these sites will receive weekly deliveries of free (to consumers) food made available through the Boston Food Bank and through the donations of surplus foods from local vendors and merchants.

Foods delivered will include fresh produce, grains, canned goods, baked goods such as pizza and quiche, pastries and breads. These foods might be U.S. Dept. of Agriculture surplus, "day old" goods or foods in dented or damaged containers unfit for retail sale, but otherwise edible.

In addition, Food For Free will be able to make emergency deliveries of food directly to the homes of elderly people or families referred by an agency as being in need of emergency food (within 24 hours of referral).

The new service will be well publicized as soon as the contracts and logistical details have been worked out.
