

To the hon.^d Mayor and Aldermen
of the City of Cambridge.

The undersigned owners of marsh land
bounded by Court Street on the east
and west lines thereof; respectfully repre-
sent, that in their opinion the location
of a portion of said street, as adopted by
the Mayor and Aldermen Dec 3, 1856 per
plan dated in October 1856 is incorrect.

And respectfully petition that the
part of said road to wit: the part which
is laid out, of the width of sixty feet
between the northerly line of Broad Canal
and the ~~northerly~~ line of the salt
marsh, (or six rods from the ~~northeast~~
corner of Edmund Munroe's dwelling
house) may be surveyed and located
eight and one half feet westerly of its
present location, as indicated upon
the plan as adopted Dec 3, 1856; so
as in the opinion of your petitioners
will conform to the location of the street
by the County Commissioners, as appears
upon record in the Clerk's office for the
County of Middlesex; also that the
ditch or creek which was dug up for
