

# City of Cambridge

The Public Service Committee conducted a public meeting on Monday, August 11, 1997 at five o'clock and forty-five minutes p.m. in the Sullivan Chamber.

Present at the meeting were Vice Mayor Born, Chair of the Committee, Councillors Henrietta Davis, Timothy J. Toomey, Jr., Anthony D. Galluccio, Kenneth E. Reeves, Mayor Sheila T. Russell, Donna P. Lopez, Deputy City Clerk; Richard Rossi, Deputy City Manager; Jill Herold, Assistant City Manager for Human Services; Paul Ryder, Recreation Director; Ralph Dunphy, Commissioner of Public Works; Steve White, Deputy Director of Public Works; Cathy Fosher, Richard Medeiros and Eileen DeLouchrey from Public Works Department and Stuart Dash, Community Development Department.

Vice Mayor Born opened the meeting by stating the meeting was called to discuss some of the issues that have come before the City Council regarding the parks that the City maintains. The parks on MDC land are not under city jurisdiction. Issues to be discussed at this meeting included regular park maintenance, including trash collection and turf maintenance, as well as the need for capital improvements at some parks. Vice Mayor Born stated that she had done a survey of 35 parks during the week and they were abuzz with Public Works workers. She stated that the plantings at the underpass in Harvard Square are beautiful. She stated that this meeting was a way to put heads together to figure out why it seemed to take so long to get to adequate maintenance of the parks underway this summer and to see how we can prevent this from reoccurring. She stated that in preparation for this meeting she asked for material on who is responsible for the maintenance of the city parks. **Attachment A** was the response to her City Council order on park maintenance. There should be someone responsible for the maintenance of each park, she said.

Councillor Davis asked for an explanation of the categories. Commissioner Dunphy responded that **Attachment B** lists the parks and the crew information for the parks in which maintenance is contracted in the city. **Attachment C**, Commissioner Dunphy stated, is a list of the parks and the crew the personnel from Public Works maintains. A list of the flower plantings and their locations throughout the city was also provided. (Attachment D).

Vice Mayor Born asked about the grading of the parks. Deputy City Manager Rossi stated that the parks which are in need of the greatest capital improvements are graded C, D or F.

At five o'clock and fifty-five minutes p.m. the chair opened the meeting to public comment.

The committee heard from George Despotes, Winthrop and Dunster Streets, who stated that the city should take a fresh look at the parks. He stated that there was new technology which could provide surveillance cameras in parks so that the city could do a daily or weekly update on the conditions of the parks. Mr. Despotes stated that the citizens do not know who is responsible for the maintenance of the parks.

The committee heard from Robb Johnson, 342 Allston Street, member of the Cambridgeport Study Group and the Friends of Magazine Beach, who stated that there was a RFP proposal for Riverside Press Park for renovation plans. He stated it would be useful to know about this, before hand. Is there a process for public involvement he asked. He stated that it was his experience that graffiti removal was initiated by a telephone call by a member of the public. This removal process should be more routine, he said.

Vice Mayor Born questioned Mr. Rossi about the Riverside Press Park project. Mr. Rossi stated that the Riverside Press project was an equipment replacement project. This was a budget item which was approved and broken equipment pieces were replaced. Mr. Johnson asked what was being replaced.

Mr. Stuart Dash stated that it was a full replacement of the climbing structure. Mr. Steve White informed Mr. Johnson that the replacement of the equipment was to bring the structure up to the current safety standards. Mr. Johnson stated that it would be helpful to communicate this information to the public.

Councillor Davis asked who decides what equipment will be replaced. Mr. Paul Ryder, Recreation Director, stated that the city needs to follow federal guidelines for equal access for persons with disabilities. Replacement is done with consideration of disability and liability issues. Mr. Dash stated that the replacement of equipment was from a maintenance capital account which allows for limited equipment replacement and does not require a full process.

Councillor Davis stated that the design of the climbing structure is huge and it fills the whole tot lot. The scale of the structure is not like replacing a smaller structure. The public, she said, might want an opportunity to say what is appropriate for the park. Councillor Davis stated that it would make sense to get some input from the neighborhood. She further stated that it might be helpful to have just one meeting with the neighborhood about this climbing equipment.

The committee heard from Elaine Fisher, 7 McTernan Street, who stated that her kitchen window is seven feet from Dana Park and her concerns are about the chain link fence which has been kicked by the kids and is pushed out into the public way and can cause injury. Her other concern is the sand the kids throw on the sidewalk. She suggested adding one more log to keep the sand in the park. She suggested that the city loam and seed the park. Ms. Fisher stated the park is supposed to be maintained three times a week, but is only maintained on Mondays. She informed the committee that the maintenance crews are very friendly. She further stated that the children changed the sign which lists the hours when the park is opened.

Vice Mayor Born asked Mr. Rossi about the capital improvement plan for Dana Park. Mr. Rossi stated that Dana Park needs a lot of work. The lack of rain and the lack of an irrigation system did not help the conditions in the park. The replacement of the equipment is also costly. The pathways need to be repaved in some areas. The trees need to be pruned and mulched. He suggested the placement of a sign on the stump to alert the neighborhood that it will be removed. Councillor Davis stated that there was a new group, Friends of Dana Park, formed by Josie Patterson and Ben Lynch, and they have included a list of improvements they would like to have done. Mr. Dunphy stated the parks are being taken care of by contractors until October 1st. The contractors did not have the maintenance schedule for Riverside Press Park, Hoyt Field and Dana Park in place early enough in the season and there was no back up plan. Dana Park, he said, has a contractor from April 15 to October 15. The bald spot in the center of the park is from years of abuse. Councillor Davis stated that 150 special trees are to be planted throughout the City in the next ten years, some of these trees should be planted in Dana Park. The irrigation system and the plan to replace the turf by next spring have been requested by the Friends of Dana Park. Mr. Rossi stated that an incredible amount of people bring their dogs to Dana Park and when the dogs urinate on the turf, the turf dies.

Councillor Toomey asked Mr. Dunphy if Public Works has been maintaining Dana Park since April 15th. Mr. Dunphy responded in the affirmative. Councillor Toomey further asked if the employees of Public Works were maintaining all the parks including the parks that were the responsibility of the contractors. Mr. Dunphy said that Public Works has tried to do so, but was delayed by about six weeks because of the storm which caused so many trees to be knocked down, and the drought. When the special conditions subside we go back to other things, he said.

Vice Mayor Born asked how the city can prevent this from happening next year. Mr. White stated that the City can tighten the specs with more information for the bids.

Councillor Toomey stated that there should be no private contractors working for the City. He stated that \$650,000 each year goes to private contractors; we need to run these parks ourselves. He further stated that contractors bid low to get the parks and then they cannot do the work. Is the City going to allocate the money for these contractors, he asked. Public Works employees should be controlling these parks. He asked who is monitoring these private contractors. Councillor Toomey stated that the Public Works budget has had two laborers cut each year. We do not have enough money appropriated to the Public Works Department. They cannot keep up with the work, we need to put more personnel into Public Works.

Vice Mayor Born asked who was assigned to monitor private contractors. Mr. Dunphy stated personnel in the parks division are assigned to monitor private contractors. Mr. Richard Medeiros stated that there are three inspectors in his division.

Vice Mayor Born stated she would like a sample of the specs.

Councillor Galluccio asked what criterion was used to decide which parks would go to private contractors. He asked why the Public Works Department doesn't staff the parks. Mr. Rossi stated that the city has used private contractors for twelve years and had success until recently. Councillor Galluccio stated that youth and youth groups from the city come first with the use of the parks. He stated that the fields are being ruined by other permit users.

Councillor Sullivan stated that down time for the parks does not exist. There is no place to go. There should be a time frame when the parks can be available for general use. Mr. Ryder stated three years ago Hoyt Field was turned over one day a week for group use, it was a mistake, he said. Mr. Ryder stated that the City upgrades 2-3 parks per year.

Councillor Toomey stated that it is an issue of privatization. He stated it is an issue of whether the city would have a parks division of the Public Works Department in a few years. He questioned the Monday, Wednesday and Friday maintenance schedules. Mr. Dunphy responded that the parks get heavy use on the weekends. He further noted the schedules and fragility of people who maintain the parks, citing sick leave and vacation time. All have an impact on the department. Mr. Dunphy stated that the parks department gets absorbed by the Public Works Department to use the personnel as the demand warrants.

Councillor Sullivan questioned the April 1st deadline for the contractors. Mr. Dunphy responded that the contractors are in place prior to April 1st.

Councillor Reeves questioned who patrols the parks to see how they look. Mr. Dunphy responded that there are particular people in the parks department who inspect the parks and the maintenance crews to evaluate the needs and communicate back to the department. He stated that there are people in the parks checking their condition. Councillor Reeves responded that this was not his experience. He further stated that he could not believe that the City let the City Hall lawn go brown and then watered the lawn. He stated that the Cambridge Housing Authority has green grass. These are two publicly funded organizations with two very different outcomes, he said. He suggested that the City should go ask the Housing Authority what they do and ask them to help us do the same. He stated that as a City Councillor he was not taking responsibility for this action because he had expressed his concern many times. Councillor Reeves inquired about the city landscaping person. Mr. Dunphy responded that the position of landscaper has been advertised. He further stated that the City has met with the Housing Authority, but their responsibilities are different from the City's.

Councillor Reeves stated that a lot of money was spent to upgrade Hoyt Field and this summer the field did not look like the same field it did three years ago. If the parks are not maintained, he stated, it will take a long time to come back. He stated he wanted someone to address the condition of the parks. If the City needs more personnel then we should provide the funding for more personnel, he said. He commented that it did not make sense to plant flowers at the end of July. He stated that the City needed to hire a landscape architect.

The committee heard from Lois Kessin, 11 Cogswell Avenue, Eastern Mass Womens Team, Lesley College Soccer and Softball Coach, who thanked Paul Ryder for his help. She stated that the City needs to figure out practice and playing fields. She stated that the women's leagues have the use of Luisitana and Glacken Field. She asked when Glacken and Luisitana would be renovated. Mr. Rossi stated that Luisitana would be renovated in the next three years. Mr. Ryder stated that Glacken needs a Master Plan. Ms. Kessin stated that if the fields are in jeopardy, loose dogs and people should be kept off of them.

The committee heard from Clarinda Spinelli, 41 Bowdoin Street, representing the Friends of Raymond Park, who stated that the friends group was started last year. She stated that the City needs more money allocated for the parks. It is a quality of life issue, she said. Ms. Spinelli stated that many residents do not have any open space and Raymond Park is important to them. She further stated that as more demand is put on the City for open space, the City needs to be in partnership with the community. The friends groups could be the mechanism through which reports could be made to the City on the maintenance of the parks, she said. Ms. Spinelli stated that communication is a key issue, she stressed the need to get the information to the proper person in the city. If the City does not get information out to the public it is a missed opportunity on the City's part, she said. Ms. Spinelli stated that dog owners are not putting their dogs on leashes, tickets are being given out and people pay them. As long as the dog are allowed to run free this will cost more money as they tear up the fields. She added that we need to find more money to replace the fields. In conclusion, she said, the bottom line is money -- cough it up!

The committee heard from William Jones who praised the employees of the Public Works Department. Mr. Medeiros does a good job with the personnel he has at his disposal. He informed the committee that Dana Park was left for dogs. The stump was left for the dogs. He was opposed to the use of contractors.

The committee heard from Rick Gosselin, 342 Allston Street, who stated that the Open Space Committee did not have a representative from the community. He stated that there should also be an early childhood specialist on the committee to advocate for the school kids for the parks for the year 2000. He stated that the Friends of Magazine Beach have taken over the responsibility of the park. The City, he said, should encourage other communities to form a friends group. He felt that the groups should be encouraged to use the parks without having to pay the \$45.00 fee.

Mr. Rossi explained that the Open Space Committee is an interdepartmental, coordinating committee. There are many opportunities available for public participation in open space planning.

The committee heard from Donnie Downs, 187 Otis Street, President of the East Cambridge Little League, who asked why the other 27 communities in the bay state area have parks in better condition than Cambridge. The parks in the city are well utilized, he said. He stated that there is a lot of abuse of the parks at night and the other issue is dogs.

Vice Mayor Born asked if the outside contractors were the same group of people for FY 96 and 97 for the same amount of money. Mr. Dunphy responded in the affirmative and stated that it did not include FY 98.

Vice Mayor Born made the following motion:

That the committee be provided with the following information before the next meeting of the Public Service Committee:

1. Written documentation regarding the FY 98 contractors, including when they began, which parks were covered by which contractors. Provide a copy of the contract with specs. Compare the work described in these bid specifications to what the city crews are expected to do. Describe how the contracts are managed internally and the quality of work is assured.

2. City Manager's capital improvement plans for open space for the next 3-4 years. In particular parks, graded C and D.

3. A plan for implementing "site based" management program for parks

4. Update by the end of September on the plans for City Hall, City Hall Annex

5. Augmented flower planting program for next year.

6. Information about feasibility of a planting and maintenance plan for areas around schools.

7. Analysis of the permit users of the parks. How many groups are from outside the city?

8. More information on the Open Space Committee and its membership.

Mr. Rossi stated that the School Department should have a representative address the planting outside of schools.

Mr. Dash stated that the Community Development Department conducts afternoon workshops to create the vision for the design and maintenance of the parks.

Councillor Davis made the following recommendations:

The city should implement a:

1. policy eliminating permit fees for the "friend" groups

2. brief public process for the Riverside Press Park tot lot structure should be initiated.

3. Public Service Committee to request the City Administration to inform the public as much as possible on the issue of park maintenance with updates.

Councillor Reeves stated that the Boston Public Gardens has a friends association and it looks beautiful. This is a money and commitment issue, he said. The City needs to set the vision and then update the vision, he stated. Councillor Reeves stated that it was not up to the friends group to tell him about the parks; he wants the city administration to tell him that the parks are clean. He further stated that the City should include more people who are involved with gardening.

At the conclusion of the meeting Vice Mayor Born stated that she would like to see immediate action to the items outlined, and expects to hold another meeting above in the fall.

The meeting adjourned at eight o'clock and five minutes p. m.

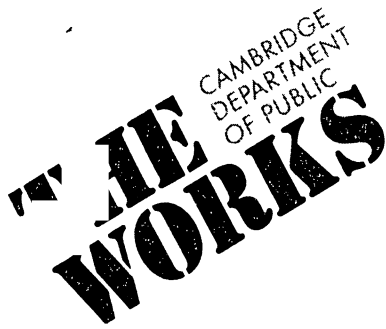
