- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that Harry Fleming will soon retire from active duty as a Cambridge Police Officer, completing twenty-eight years of service; and
- WHEREAS: Harry was appointed as a Reserve Patrolman on May 20, 1953 and reported for active duty on April 18, 1954, being made permanent on July 15, 1956 and from that point forward he received many varying assignments completing each with his usual trait for perfection; and
- WHEREAS: During the early 1970's when it was deemed by the City Administration that Housing Code Enforcement was not properly staffed nor maintained, Officer Fleming was assigned to the Health Department in an effort to ensure compliance of the Housing and Sanitation Codes and regulations; and
- WHEREAS: Several years later, Detective Fleming was placed in charge of security at the Cambridge Hospital, the assignment from which he will retire; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the City Council go on record extending its deep appreciation and gratitude to Officer Harry Fleming as he retires from active duty on the Police Department and to further extend to him its every good wish for health and happiness; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Officer Fleming on behalf of the entire City Council.
