

In Metropolitan District Commission
Boston, Mass., October 30, 1958

ORDERED that, on petition of New England Telephone and Telegraph Company dated September 29, 1958, for locations shown on plan of New England Telephone and Telegraph Company dated July 24, 1958, and indexed accession number 37222X, for approximately 251 feet of buried cable, conduit and manhole in Memorial Drive from a point approximately 940 feet southwesterly from Mt. Auburn Street, southerly, southeasterly and easterly, in the City of Cambridge, for the transmission of intelligence by electricity, said Memorial Drive being a boulevard under the care and control of this Commission, said locations having been found by order of the Department of Public Utilities to be required by public convenience and necessity, said plan and petition being on file in the office of this Commission, a hearing on said petition having been given by this Commission on Thursday, October 30, 1958, at 2:00 P.M., at the office of the Commission in Boston, of which hearing due notice was given to all persons interested of the time and place by publishing a copy of said petition and the order of notice issued thereon by this Commission in a newspaper published in the City of Cambridge, being the city in which the location petitioned for would lie, the first publication having been made at least fourteen days prior to the date of said hearing, and it appearing, in the opinion of this Commission that public convenience and necessity so require, said New England Telephone and Telegraph Company is hereby granted location for said buried cable, conduit and manhole in said Memorial Drive to the extent and upon the terms, conditions and obligations hereinafter specified, the same being such as the public necessity and a due regard for the rights of the Commonwealth require, namely:-

1. The New England Telephone and Telegraph Company shall

conform to all provisions of law applicable to the exercise of the rights and performance of the work under this grant and to the rules and regulations of the Metropolitan District Commission.

2. The New England Telephone and Telegraph Company shall do the work of installing said buried cable, conduit and manhole in the location hereby granted subject to the approval of the Director of Park Engineering of the Commission as to time, manner and location and in all other respects.

3. Said New England Telephone and Telegraph Company shall indemnify and save harmless the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and the Metropolitan District Commission from any damage it or they may sustain or be required to pay arising out of the exercise by said Company of the rights hereby granted or by reason of any negligence of said Company or any of its employees in connection with the work done hereunder.

4. Said New England Telephone and Telegraph Company shall protect and maintain all trees, drainage or water pipes, and all appurtenances or structures either above or below the surface of the ground over which this location lies, and upon completion of the work shall restore the surface of the ground to the condition in which it was at the time of this grant and in a manner satisfactory to said Director of Park Engineering of the Commission, and shall maintain the surface of the ground and the location throughout in such condition to the satisfaction of said Director.

5. The New England Telephone and Telegraph Company shall place and maintain proper barriers at all times and from the beginning of twilight through the whole of every night sufficient lights to protect the public from injury or damage during the progress of the work under this grant

or during repairs upon said buried cable, conduit and manhole and work on the location which may hereafter become necessary.

6. No work shall be done under this grant without first obtaining a permit therefor from said Director of Park Engineering and subject to conditions imposed by him.

The above is a true copy of order passed at a meeting of the Metropolitan District Commission, held in Boston on Thursday, October 30, 1958, as appears by record in this office.

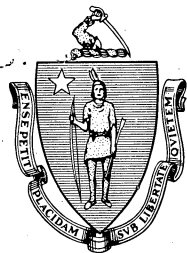

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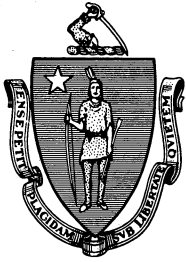

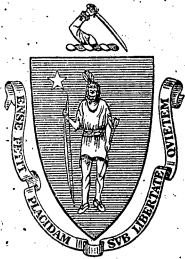

Petition of New England Telephone and Telegraph Company for determination by the Department that public convenience and necessity require locations for buried cable and manhole to be used for the transmission of intelligence by electricity in Memorial Drive in the city of Cambridge.

Appearance: William Whalen, for the Petitioner

This is a petition brought under the provisions of Chapter 92, section 43 of the General Laws of Massachusetts, as amended, by the New England Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the state of New York and lawfully engaged in the distribution of telephone and its allied services in the city of Cambridge for determination by this Department that public convenience and necessity require locations in a portion of a public street in said city of Cambridge, namely Memorial Drive from a point approximately nine hundred and forty (940) feet southwesterly from Mount Auburn Street southerly, southeasterly and easterly approximately two hundred and fifty-one (251) feet of buried cable, also one (1) manhole, and from proposed manhole 471 northerly, approximately two (2) feet of conduit, to be used for the transmission of intelligence by electricity and to be owned by your petitioner. Said Memorial Drive is under the care and control of the Metropolitan District Commission.

Aplan entitled "N. E. T. & T. Co. No. 05-478 Cambridge July 24, 1958 Plan for Proposed Manhole and Buried Cable Location and Conduit Location" showing the proposed locations is on file with the petition.

After notice and a public hearing at which no one appeared in opposition, it appears that the locations for the transmission of intelligence by electricity are required by public convenience and necessity.

Accordingly, the Department

FINDS, by order, that locations in portions of a public street in said city of Cambridge, namely Memorial Drive from a point approximately nine hundred and forty (940) feet southwesterly from Mount Auburn Street, southerly, southeasterly and easterly approximately two hundred and fifty one (251) feet of buried cable, also one (1) manhole, and from proposed manhole 471 northerly, approximately two (2) feet of conduit to be used for the transmission of intelligence by electricity are required by public convenience and necessity.

An appeal as to matters of law from any final decision, order or ruling of the commission, may be taken to the supreme judicial court by an aggrieved party in interest by the filing of a written petition praying that the order of the commission be modified or set aside in whole or in part.

Such petition for appeal shall be filed with the secretary of the commission within twenty days after the date of the decision, order or ruling of the commission, or within such further time as the commission may allow upon request filed prior to the expiration of the twenty days after said decision, order or ruling. 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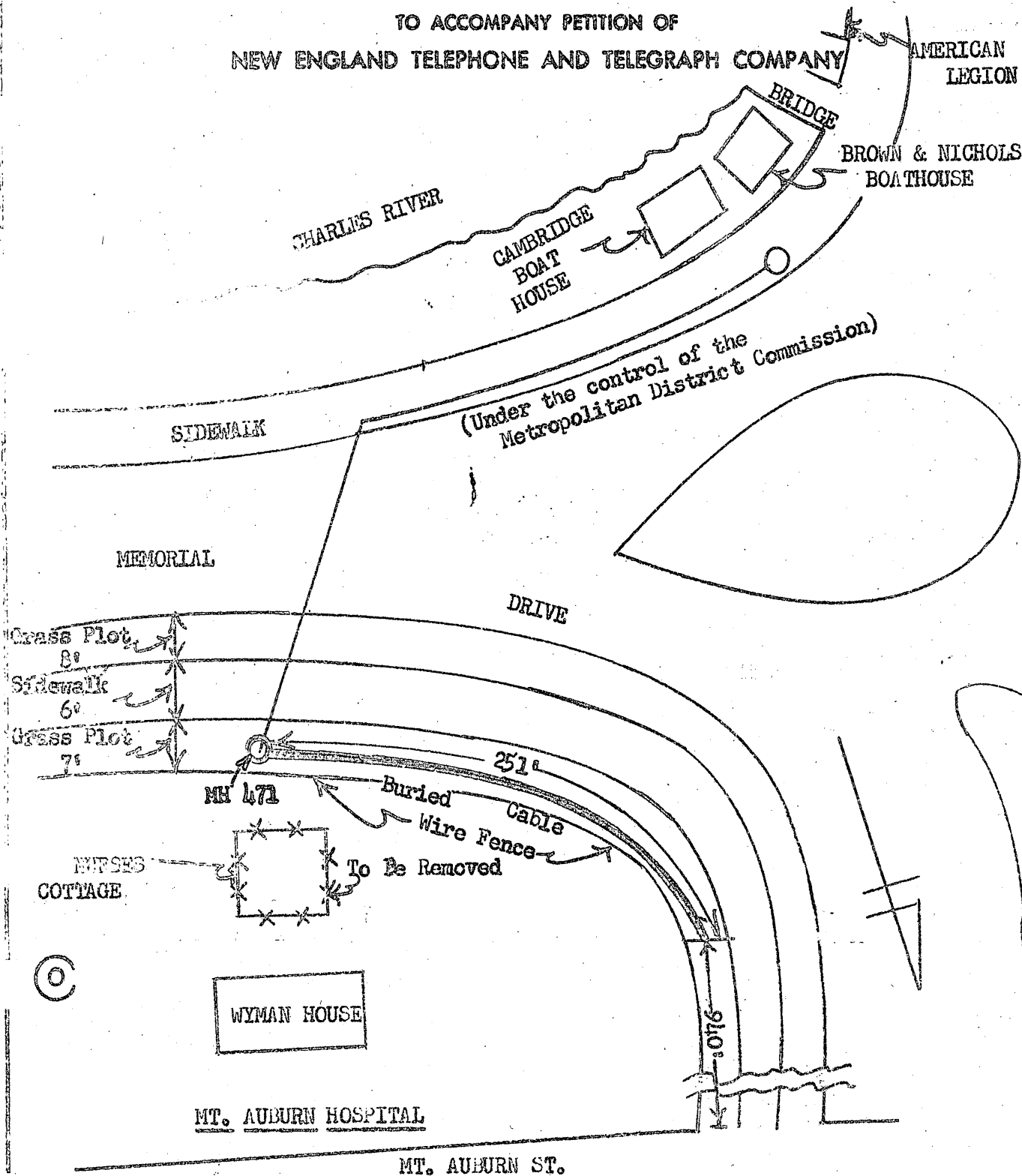
