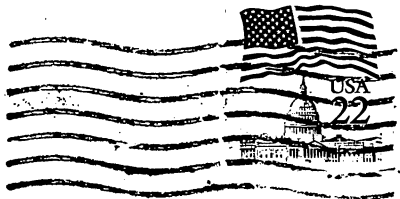

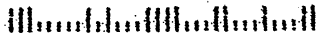

City bans some tests on animals

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (UPI) — A first-in-the-nation ban on commercial testing of animals approved by the Cambridge City Council prohibits procedures that blind rabbits and kill dogs simply so labs can develop cosmetics and shampoos, animal rights activists say.

All nine members of the council voted without discussion Monday night for an ordinance that does not affect tests on animals for human medical research but does ban two tests used for developing cosmetics and household chemicals.

The ordinance subjects laboratories that ignore the ban to up to \$250 in fines per violation per day and gives the city Animal Commission power to shut down research institutions that commit serious or repeated violations.

The ordinance, described by animal rights groups as the first of its kind, specifically prohibits two tests, the LD-50 and the Draize, that are used to determine the toxicity of cosmetics and household chemicals.

In the Draize, rabbits are placed in stocks and immobilized, said Gul Agha, president of the Cambridge Committee for Responsible Research, a citizens' group with 800 members.

"Their eyes are forcibly kept open and substances such as mascaras and shampoos are sprayed in high concentrations," he said. "The decay of the cornea tissue of the eye is observed for the next week or so. Basically, they can go blind and the eyes turn red. There's no escape."

The LD-50 involves tests on animals such as mice, monkeys or dogs in which they are forcibly fed a household chemical until half the population dies, Agha said.

Ban on commercial animal tests

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (UPI) — The Cambridge City Council voted unanimously Monday night to enact a first-in-the-nation ban on commercial laboratory testing of animals within the city.

Before a crowd of supporters and the glare of television lights, all nine council members voted without discussion to approve the proposal, which subjects laboratories ignoring the ban to up to \$250 in fines per violation per day.

In addition, the ban stipulates that any research institution which commits serious or repeated violations of the ordinance may be closed.

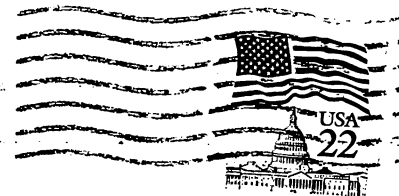
The ban will affect research on more than 50,000 animals that is now occurring within the 6-square-mile city, officials estimated.

The animals are used to test cosmetics, tobacco products, industrial chemicals, pesticides and engine exhaust.

The city ordinance specifically prohibits two types of lab tests, known as the LD-50 and Draize tests, which are conducted on animals to determine the toxicity of household chemicals and cosmetics.

It does not affect researchers who conduct laboratory tests of animals for human medical research, officials said.

Some say animals owe us. They owe us nothing. They should have just as much right to a life without pain & suffering as we do.

Again you should feel very good about ending the needless suffering of thousands of animals.


