An Ordinance

Establishing the Salary of the City Clerk.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:—

SECT. 1. From and after the first Monday in January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the City Clerk shall receive an annual salary of one thousand dollars, exclusive of fees established by law, payable in equal quarterly payments; which shall be in full for all services rendered in his official capacity.

SECT. 2. So much of the Ordinance in relation to Salaries, on page 127 of the volume of the Revised Ordinances adopted by the City Council December 24, 1856, as relates to the salary of the City Clerk, is hereby repealed.
