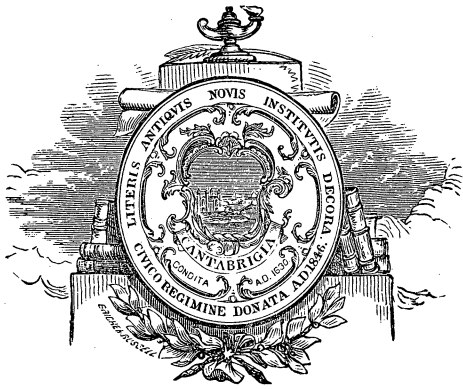




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

Sept. 15 1884.

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that *Holyoke Street, so-called, between South and Mill Streets,*

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land *about twenty feet* in width between *said South and Mill Streets*

included between the *black* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *the City Engineer, and dated April 12, 1882,*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid,

Adopted. Sent down for concurrence.

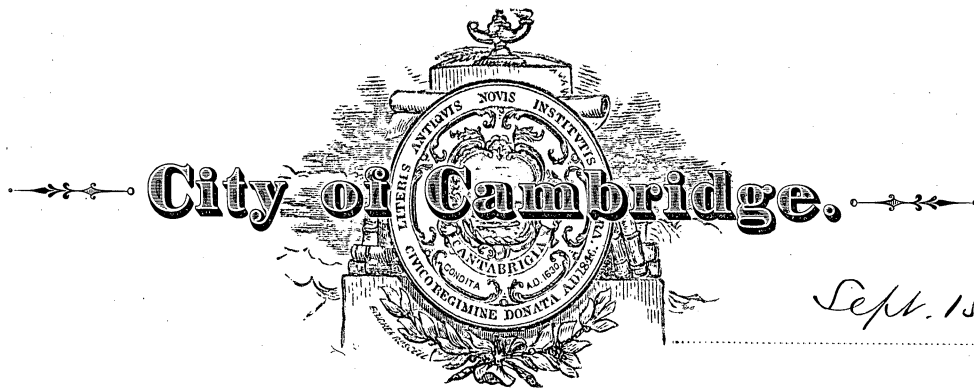
