WHEREAS:

Cambridge and Youville Hospitals are apparently both planning to construct new heating plants in the near future; and

WHEREAS:

An August 1982 study of district heating by the Community Development Department suggests that co-generation of steam for heat resulting from electricity generation can save significant amount of energy and reduce costs; and

WHEREAS:

The Cambridge Steam Company already produces available steam for Harvard University from its Blackstone Street electric generating station; and

WHEREAS:

The policy of the city of Cambridge continues to promote energy conservation in all sectors of our economy; therefore be it

ORDERED:

That the City Manager direct the Community Development Department to study the feasibility of constructing a steam line from the current steam facilities at Harvard up Cambridge Street to the two hospitals, and to report to the City Council in writing not later than February 2, 1983.
