IN CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS:-

On the 23rd day of October 1972, death brought to a close the active life of Charles H. Whiting at the age of 97 years.

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Charles H. Whiting was born in Wilton, New Hampshire in 1875 and was a member of the 1897 class at Harvard College prior to his entering the family milk business where he distinguished himself as an able executive and as a pioneer in the field of pasteurization and a vigorous leader in the efforts to establish laws leading to the purification of milk

WHEREAS:-

Charles H. Whiting was active in all walks of community life having served as a member of the Cambridge City Council in 1910, and was active in both the religion and educational fields as a member of fund raising activities for the First Parish Unitarian Church and as President of the Cambridge Public School Association and claimed membership in the Cambridge Historical Society

WHEREAS:-

The stature he attained in this community by his exemplary life and monumental achievements was recognized during his lifetime



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THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:-

That the Mayor and City Council of the City of Cambridge by this resolution and public record recognize the profound influence of Charles H. Whiting upon the community life of the City of Cambridge and the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:-

That this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this City Council and a copy sent to his daughter, Mrs. Lawrence B. Ellis, in recognition of his respected place in this community.
