That the Board of Park Commissioners be and hereby is requested to submit an estimate to cover the cost of erecting a chain link fence on the water side of the Fresh Pond Playground, also for the laying out and equipping of said playground for recreational purposes.

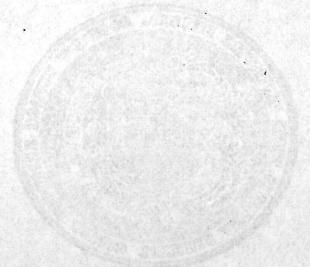


The Honorable, the City Council:

I return herewith for the purpose of further consideration an order adopted by your Honorable Board at its meeting Nov. 18 requesting the Water Board to lease to the Board of Park Commissioners for a period of ninety-nine years land known as the Fresh Pond Playground.

I have talked with the City Solicitor in relation to this proposed lease, and in his opinion it does not seem advisable for one department of the city to enter into a lease with another department of the city. I have also talked with officials of the Water Department and they are perfectly agreeable that this particular land should be used for playground purposes as it has been for the past few years. These officials feel that satisfactory arrangements may be made between the Water Board and the Park Department for a continuance of the same.

I therefore recommend that a committee of your Board be appointed to confer with the officials of the Water Board and the Park Department with a view to bringing about satisfactory arrangements whereby this land may be used for playground purposes.
