- WHEREAS: John E. (Jack) Austin was a longtime resident of Cambridge at 48 Avon Hill Avenue, as well as a devoted husband, father of three, and good friend to many; and
- WHEREAS: Jack Austin was born and raised in Chester, Pennsylvania and attended college and graduate school at Yale and Columbia Universities where he studied English; and
- WHEREAS: Jack Austin's eloquence in prose and his acute mind made him a very popular college lecturer and administrator at several schools, including Vassar College, Harvard Business School, Pine Manor College, and finally Tufts University, where he was able to blend the approach gained from his broad liberal arts education with his concern for the human factor in our increasingly technological society; and
- WHEREAS: Jack Austin was an active participant in neighborhood matters and city politics, and was a committed member of Christ Church, where his devotion to his church and his leadership in church matters and policies enabled him to help others to feel instantly part of that community; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council sends deepest condolences to the Austin family--Jack's wife Ann; daughters Marion Hunt and Bliss, and son John, as well as to his mother and sister; and further be it
