COUNCILLOR WYLIE

ORDERED:

That due to the cutting down at the Fresh Pond Reservation last week by city workers of two ornamental dogwood trees in full bloom, which had been purchased and planted by the City at great cost only within the past three years, the apparent result of a failure to properly plan and supervise brush cutting and pruning operations, and due to similar excesses in past years, the City Manager is requested to suspend cutting and brush clearing in Fresh Pond Reservation until he has taken the following steps:-

1. Received from the Water Board and the Department of Public Works, and reviewed, a written plan detailing all such work for the remainder of the year, including a personnel chart, assignment of responsibilities, a description by area of what is to be cut and what is to be saved, a means for marking and preserving what is not to be cut, adequate training measures for all personnel engaged in cutting.
2. Received from the Water Board and the Department of Public Works a plan for cutting and removing the numerous dead and dangerous trees in the Reservation.
3. Been assured that adequate supervision will exist and that the personnel in charge understand that they will be held responsible for destruction of any valuable city property.
