- WHEREAS: Cambridge Community Planning is the only non-profit planning organization for Cambridge that assumes a pivotal role in initiating productive partnership and community projects and has responded to and served the human service needs of the Cambridge Community for the last fifty years since 1938; and
- WHEREAS: The mandate of the Cambridge Community Services is to identify major human service issues in Cambridge and to develop collaborative resources and programs to respond to these needs; and
- WHEREAS: Cambridge Community Services has responded to the needs of youth in Cambridge through programs such as Cambridge TeenWork, which placed more than 1,000 high school students in private sector jobs; the Adolescent Parent Employability Program which assists pregnant and parenting high school students to achieve self-sufficiency; and the Winning Edge, a soon to be implemented drop out prevention program; and
- WHEREAS: Some examples of the Cambridge Community Services task forces and collaboratives have included: The Adult Literacy Task Force, The Cambridge Day Care Alliance and The Cambridge Youth Employment Program Collaborative; and
- WHEREAS: This agency also publishes the CCS Directory of Community Services, a guide to the more than 140 Community Service Organizations in Cambridge and the Cambridge Community Column, a newsletter that covers local programs and fundraising activities; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby proclaim December 15, 1988 to be CAMBRIDGE COMMUNITY SERVICES DAY in the City of Cambridge in honor of the agency's long history of service to the community; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution be forwarded to W. Easley Hamner, President of Cambridge Community Services and Lynn D'Ambrose, Executive Director, Cambridge Community Services.
