RESOLVED: That I, Kenneth E. Reeves, and the entire City Council hereby proclaim June 16, 1992, as DAY OF THE AFRICAN CHILD and invite the citizenry of our City, to honor on this day, the accomplishments and struggles of Africa's past, and the peace and prosperity envisioned for its future.
