In 1985 he received his Masters Degree in Education from Harvard University and joined the MIT Media Lab where he worked to develop a classroom learning system based on the marriage of Lego toys with the Logo computer language. He went on to the open Lego Futura Lab in Boston office as the Senior Research Designer where he further developed a Lego system of computerized "bricks," motors and gears that inspired children to strengthen their problem solving skills through creative play. In 1997 he married Susan Sjöberg and spent the last years of his life deeply in love and living in Wayland, MA. He is survived by his wife Susan, son Peter and grandson Oscar and Susan.
