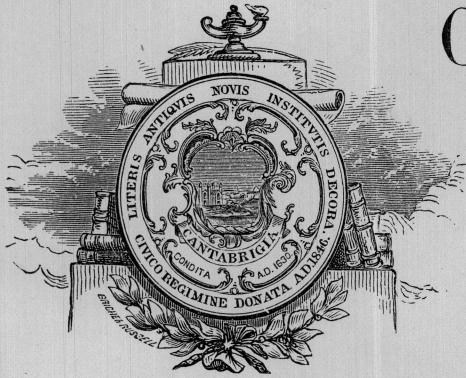

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Pleasant Street

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land in width between

forty feet

River St. and Florence St.

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by

J. G. Chase

City Engineer, dated June 30, 1870,

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid. *and that two months be allowed for the removal of fences or other obstructions standing thereon.*
