WHEREAS:

There is very little parking space in the City of Cambridge,  
and

WHEREAS:

There is little or no parking space provided for many city  
employees, and

WHEREAS:

It is in the national and local interest to discourage commuters  
from traveling by car and to encourage the use of public transportation, and

WHEREAS:

There are more important uses for available public land, and

WHEREAS:

The city is making plans for a modern high school plant, and

WHEREAS:

There are serious parking problems at the City Hospital, now  
therefore be it

ORDERED:

That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to prepare  
for the consideration of the City Council, after consultation with  
appropriate city officials including school officials and the Cambridge  
Transportation Forum, a proposed policy on parking for all city employees  
including school employees. Such a policy might include:-

1. Providing parking only for employees who must  
travel by car in the course of their working  
day (such as doctors, inspectors and school  
directors.)
2. Providing parking at a fee.
3. Providing bicycle parking.
