- WHEREAS: The Honorable Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr., Son of Cambridge and lifelong Cantabrigian, distinguished himself in a lengthy and productive political career as a Representative in the Great and General Court of Massachusetts from 1937 through 1952, and presided as Speaker of the Massachusetts House from 1949 through 1952; and
- WHEREAS: From 1953 through 1986, as Congressman from this Eighth Congressional District, not only did he represent the citizens of Cambridge well, he also responded fully to the hopes, fear and concerns of all people in this very diverse city; and
- WHEREAS: His colleagues selected him to occupy the office of and to preside as the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, where his tenure lasted for 10 years; and
- WHEREAS: The Honorable Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. has detailed his life at the heart of history and his political memoirs in the recently published book entitled MAN OF THE HOUSE; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council declare Friday, November 20, 1987 as "TIP COMES HOME DAY"; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That in observance of this day, all citizens of Cambridge are invited and urged to meet, hear and speak with the former Speaker, The Honorable Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. on Friday, November 20, 1987 between the hours of SIX and EIGHT P.M. at the James Fitzgerald Auditorium in the Cambridge Rindge & Latin School.
