- WHEREAS: The American Folklore Society members study traditional culture, ballads, baskets and riddles and share with each other their research and scholarship; and
- WHEREAS: This wonderful society is comprised of over 1200 members: teachers, filmmakers, directors of federal and state folklife agencies, archivists and writers whose aim is to seek out documents and present America's folklore and life; and
- WHEREAS: On Saturday, October 29, 1988, American Folklore Society President Alan Jabbour, Director of the American Folklife Center at the Library of Congress, which just completed a study of folklife in Lowell, Massachusetts, will deliver the Annual President's Address; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That I, Alfred E. Vellucci, Mayor of the City of Cambridge, do hereby declare the week of October 24-30, 1988 "Folklore Week" to encourage public awareness of the value of our many ethnic and cultural heritages; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the citizens of Cambridge be invited to attend these folklore sessions which will take place at the Hyatt Regency Hotel.
