The subscribers,
citizens of Ward three in said City, respectfully petition
that brick sidewalks with suitable edgestones,
may be constructed (except where already existing)
as follows, viz; on the easterly side of Third Street, between
Otis and Bridge Streets; on both sides of Fifth Street
between Cambridge and Thorndike Streets; on the
northerly side of Otis Street between Fourth and Fifth Streets;
on the southerly side of Cambridge Street between Fourth and
Fifth Streets; on the northerly side of Cambridge Street between
First and Second Streets; on the easterly side of Second Street
between Cambridge and Gore Streets, and on the southerly
side of Gore Street between First and Second Streets,
and the expense thereof assessed pursuant to law.
Also that flagstones may be laid across Gore Street
near H. K. Hovey's store.
