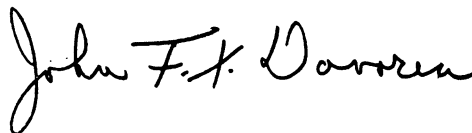

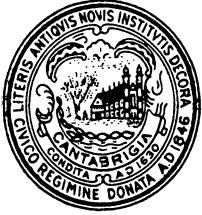

2. The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

For charitable, scientific, artistic, literary and educational purposes; to form an interracial theater as a direct means for getting persons from different races and ethnic and cultural backgrounds to work together; to develop the talents and skills of participants; to stimulate, promote and develop interest in the dramatic arts; to educate the American public in the dramatic arts; to advance the national culture in the field of dramatic arts; to bring the dramatic arts to areas and population centers that are interracial or are not customarily exposed to such dramatic arts; and in furtherance of these purposes to exercise all powers and to do all acts permitted by the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to a corporation organized under Chapter 180 of the General Laws including the powers specified in Chapter 156B Section 9, except paragraph (m) thereof, and 9A.

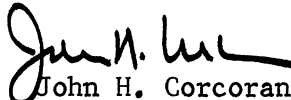
