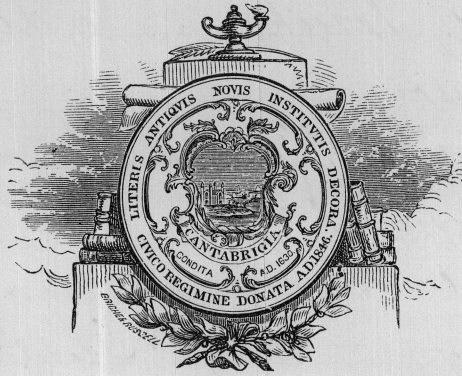


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Aldermen, *June 26* 1872

Resolved, That the public convenience and necessity require that

School Street
be widened and extended

by taking for this purpose certain parcels of land, as shown on a plan prepared by the City Engineer, and now before this Board.

Therefore, Ordered, that so much of the land on *both sides of*
School Street,

and within the prolongation of the line of said street
from its present Eastern terminus to proposed new line of Portland St.,
as is included between the *red* lines shown on a plan of *School St. on plan*
for Washington St. District Improvement,
~~Street~~, drawn by the City Engineer, dated *June 1870* and now before this
Board, be taken for public use, and laid out as a public way and a part of said *School*
Street.
