In the year One Thousand eight hundred and ~~seventy three~~, seventy three.

An Ordinance in relation to bow-windows and other projections from buildings.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge as follows:-

No person shall construct or place, or cause to be constructed or placed, any ^{balcony, balustrade,} portico, porch, door, window or step, which shall project into any street; under a penalty of not less than five nor more than twenty dollars for each offence, and a like penalty for every day that the said ^{balcony, balustrade,} portico, porch, door, window or step shall be continued as aforesaid, after notice to remove the same from the board of ^{Mayor and} Aldermen, or some person by them authorised
