Proposed Amendment to an Ordinance Establishing the Office of Clerical Assistant to the City Clerk,

In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-Seven.

AN ORDINANCE

Establishing the Office of Clerical Assistant to the City Clerk.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

SECT. 1. At the commencement of each municipal year, and whenever a vacancy may occur, there shall be elected by a joint vote of the City Council, a Clerical Assistant to the City Clerk, who shall receive compensation for his services the annual salary of one thousand dollars.

and ~~He~~ shall hold no other office under the City Government ~~and~~

and ~~He~~ shall be removable at pleasure of the City Council.

SECT. 2. The said Clerical Assistant shall render such service to the City Clerk as he may from time to time require in the performance of his duties, as established by the charter and ordinances of the city and the laws of the Commonwealth.

SECT. ~~3~~. Section 5 of Chapter 4, of the Revised Ordinances, and all ordinances amendatory thereof, providing for an allowance for clerical assistance to the City Clerk, are hereby repealed.

SECT. 4. This Ordinance shall go into effect on the first Monday in January next.
