In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-eight,

An Ordinance
in relation to the measurement of Wood
and Bark.

Be it ordained by the City
Council of the City of Cambridge, as
follows:

Section 1. No person shall expose for sale
in any street or public place in the city, any
firewood or bark before the same has been
measured by a public measurer of wood and
bark, or without a ticket signed by him, cer-
tifying the quantity which the load contains,
the name of the vendor, and the place in which
he resides.

Section 2. Every driver of such load shall, when
requested by any policeman, exhibit to him
such ticket; and it shall be the duty of
the police to see that the load corresponds with
such ticket, and to make complaint of any driver

who has not such ticket, or who refuses to exhibit the same, when requested as aforesaid, or whose load does not correspond with his ticket.

Section 3. Every driver who offers for sale fire-wood or bark, without having such a ticket, or who refuses to exhibit such ticket to a policeman when requested shall forfeit the sum of five dollars.
