- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Dr. Mary (Crutchfield) Thompson, a long time Cambridge resident and late retired Cambridge Dentist; and
- WHEREAS: Mary was born in North Carolina and was educated in Cambridge schools and was one of the first black women to graduate from Tufts University Dental School, receiving her D.D.M. in 1930; and
- WHEREAS: Dr. Thompson practiced dentistry in Cambridge for many years and also served as the Cambridge School Department Dentist, as well as having founded the low-cost Children's Dental Clinic; and
- WHEREAS: Dr. Thompson, along with her late husband moved to Natick and became extremely active in community and civic affairs, both of whom founded the first fair housing committee in Massachusetts, and Dr. Thompson was very instrumental in establishing the South Middlesex Branch of the NAACP; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the entire Thompson and Crutchfield families at this personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the family on behalf of the entire City Council.
