Obituaries

Ralph Brown, state trooper, Battle of Midway veteran; 78

Ralph V. Brown of Rye, N.H., a retired Massachusetts State Police lieutenant and a veteran of the Battle of Midway, died of a stroke Wednesday, Nov. 29, at the Sunbridge Nursing Home in Exeter, N.H. The former Cambridge resident was 78.

Mr. Brown was born in Watertown and graduated from Watertown High School.

He worked as a Navy radio operator from 1941 to 1946, serving mostly in the Pacific, including stints on the USS Santa Fe and on the USS Vincennes in the Battle of Midway.

On the Vincennes, Mr. Brown was assigned to escort a secret convoy of gold from South Africa to the United States.

According to his granddaughter, Jennifer Brown, Mr. Brown once said that when the "bombs were whizzing by" and all the activity was enough to scare most of the young soldiers, he found solace in the repetitive dots and dashes of Morse code in the radio room. Even 50 years later, his granddaughter said, he could still remember the code.

In 1949, Mr. Brown joined the Massachusetts State Police, serving in the Concord barracks and at State Police headquarters in Boston until 1972, when he retired as a lieutenant. He spent more than half of his career in crime identification, in which he dealt with fingerprinting and crime scene photos.

He later worked as a court reporter for a private agency until 1985.

Mr. Brown resided in Cambridge for 40 years and later moved to his summer home in Rye, N.H. He loved to sail and often went on solo outings in Rye Harbor.

Mr. Brown leaves his wife of 55 years, Marion (Harnish); a son, Peter, of Nantucket; two daughters, Nancy Duffie of Exeter, N.H. and Susan Howell of Needham; two sisters, Ruth Harris and Rose Waldman, both of Dover, N.H.; and five grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held at 1 p.m. Saturday in the First Baptist Church of Exeter.

E. B. Daunis, 85; was R.I. teacher

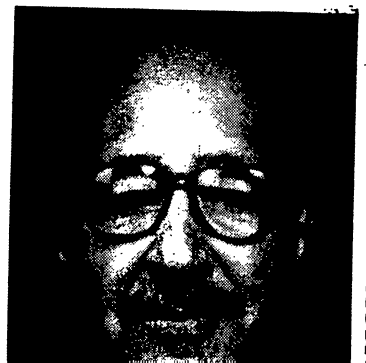
Eleanor Broderick Daunis, a founding member of the Barrington, R.I., YMCA and a former schoolteacher, died Sunday at her home in Providence. She was 85.

Mrs. Daunis was born in Boston and graduated from the Newton Country Day School of the Sacred Heart in Newton. She received a bachelor's degree in English literature from Wheaton College in Norton in 1938 and a teaching degree from Rhode Island College in 1956.

She taught in Barrington public schools until 1960, and later studied at the Alliance Francaise in Paris. She was a former member of the Barrington Yacht Club and the Rhode Island Country Club.

Mrs. Daunis was a resident of Barrington for more than 50 years before moving to Providence in 1995.

She served on the Barrington Bicentennial Committee, the Rhode Island Hospital Guild, and the Barrington Players, and was a founding member of the Barrington YMCA's board of directors. She was also active in the English Speaking Union in Providence.
