The Committee on Roads and Bridges to which were referred the petitions of sundry persons for Brick sidewalks setting of Edgestone and other Street improvements would respectfully

Report. That unless some farther provision is made for the expenses of the Street-Department for the year 1871 no action can be taken on these several petitions, as the work which has already been Ordered by the City Council, and which has been commenced, including the running expenses of the Department will amount to (\$153,000) One hundred fiftythree thousand dollars. being \$3000. in excess of the Appropriation, as reported by the Finance Committee, adopted by the Common Council, and now pending in the Board of Aldermen. Your Committee would respectfully request that a Convention of the City Council be held forthwith, for the purpose of making some change in the Appropriation bill and providing for the same by creating a City Dept. or in such other manner as the City Council may deem expedient.
