Subject Traffic Signals at Broadway, Lee Street and Fayette Street

The Traffic Department after the meeting with members of the Longellow School PTA did follow normal procedures in requesting funding under the Urban Systems Program for the installation of these lights. This is the same procedure that has always been used in the past.

We have also suggested to our State Representatives that the Governors Highway Safety Program may be a way of funding this installation.

I did state to the PTA that the City has not funded any installation of traffic signals in the past 15 years and that funding of the \$27,000.00 needed was highly unlikely by the City.

At the present time the State is evaluating our request and we have designed the intersection and wrote the specifications. As soon as we get the approval we will go out to bid.

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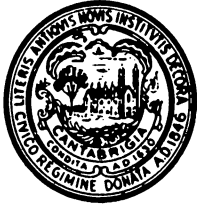
