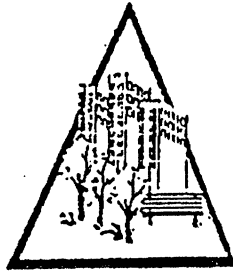

On April 27, 2002, the Fresh Pond Action Committee, in conjunction with the Irish Immigration Center, will be hosting our second annual Cambridge Black and Green celebration. The event is scheduled to take place at the Agassiz School, 28 Sacramento Street in Cambridge, Massachusetts from 7 to 10 p.m.. This year's theme is "America The Mosaic." We will focus on **poetry, music & 'n' motion**, highlighted by a Tai'Chi demonstration; with a special presentation of an "Outstanding Community Service Award" to be given to an individual of Irish descent and an individual of African descent. This year's special guests will be the **Honorable Mayor of Cambridge Michael A. Sullivan** and **Bobbie D'Alessandro, Superintendent of the Cambridge Public Schools**.
