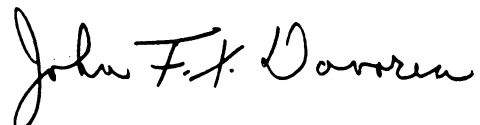

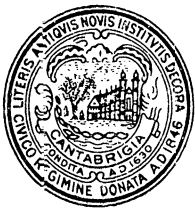

Pursuant to a communication from the Secretary of State re: "Economic Affairs Bureau, Inc.," I made an investigation. The locus is suitable.

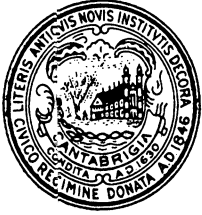

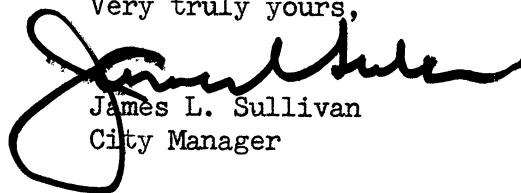
